The Holy Eucharist: Profound Intimacy and the Sacramental Power

I. Framework: Understanding of Sacraments

- A. Historical catholic thinking-from the material to the spiritual (example John 1:14)
- B. Modern protestant thinking- from the spiritual to the material (example Romans 8:9-10)
- C. The discourse with Nicodemus in John 3:1-6 seen through catholic and protestant eyes.

II. Sacraments 7 and 2

- A. Protestant- multiple meanings
 - 1. Something actually happens(efficacious) in Baptism and Communion
 - 2. Ordinance of obedience
 - 3. Symbol of remembrance
 - 4. Impact depends on the condition of the heart and internal belief

B. Catholic one universal meaning

- 1. Confer the grace they signify. They are *efficacious* because Christ himself is at work in them.
- 2. As fire transform everything it touches, so the Holy Spirit transforms all that it touches.
- 3. The sacraments act by the very fact of the action performed (ex opera operato) not by the righteousness of you or I or of the priest, but by the power of God
- 4. Fruits of the sacraments also depend on the cooperation of the one that receives them
- 5. Sacraments of the New Covenant are necessary for salvation

D. An Old Testament Example:

- 1. Leviticus 6:17-20
- II. The Foreshadow Of The Eucharist In The Old Testament
 - A. Murder over the offerings Genesis 4: 1-7
 - B. The first wine and bread immediately before the Old covenant with Abram. Genesis 14: 17-20 and Chapter 15.

- C. The Passover Ritual Exodus 12: 5-14 the blood alone is not enough!
- D. Complaints about bread- The Quail and The Manna from heaven: Exodus 16:3-12 "So that you will know that I am the Lord"
- E. Leviticus- the absolute requirement of God directed worship. Sprinkling of blood.

III. The Bread of Life Discourse: John 6

- A. Biblical consistency-
 - 1. Take the literal meaning. The word of the Lord is true and the burden of proving otherwise is on the one urging the non-literal interpretation.
 - 2. Unless the clear context calls for a non-literal interpretation (cut off your hand and eye)
- B. Multiplication of the loaves v 1-15
 - 1. Did Jesus transform the material substance of bread?
 - 2. Took, broke and gave
 - 3. More than they could eat
 - 4. 12 Baskets left over 12 apostles
 - 5. People's response
- C. Teaching in the Synagogue in Capernaum John 6: 22-45 Jesus is the Manna! Murmur
- D. v 45- 52 Jesus is living bread to eat! Quarreling!
- E. V. 53-66 Linked to salvation. Schism and departure.
- F. Words of Eternal life

- V. The Last Cup---The Passover transformed and the Hyssop Branch
